On July 12, 183 young women and men arrived at the Center for Hope, Impact Hope's new vocational training center in northern Rwanda. The trades include tailoring, hairdressing, agriculture, and culinary arts, with plans to add electricity, plumbing, and welding soon.

In the August newsletter, we shared that eleven Impact Hope (IH) university graduates were hired by the Center for Online Evangelism (COE). We want to share more in-depth the mission of the COE and how their new employees in Rwanda are making a difference in the world.

When Ed Wagner, the founder of COE, learned about Impact Hope's mission to help refugees and the need for jobs, he wanted to help. Ed and his organization supported fourteen students through university in digital marketing to eventually hire them to work in digital evangelism marketing.

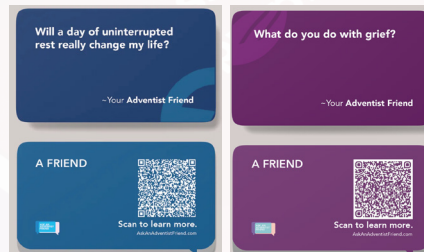
Ed has a big heart for digital ministry. With so many people going to the computer for answers, he knew the Adventist church needed a presence with relevant, up-to-date information.

His team runs askanadventistfriend.com, which answers questions about the Adventist faith in a friendly, conversational way. There

are also physical cards you can purchase as an evangelism tool that directs people to the website with a QR code that answers their questions.

In June, eleven students in Rwanda were hired as full-time employees and now work for the Ask A Friend project. Kim Wagner, the SEO strategist and team leader, told us how they are such a big help, taking their team of five SEO strategists to 15 people. Kim says, "They are motivated, hardworking, laugh a lot, and always push me to be a better teacher by asking intelligent questions."

Children Making an Impact



The primary class at Trout Creek SDA Church in Montana are helping Impact Hope graduates! When the children learned about the conditions of the refugee camps and

about Impact Hope, they were eager to help. They decided to raise funds for supplying chicken start-up kits. For every \$5, an egg goes under the fabric hen in their classroom. When 15 eggs are in the basket, the eggs are replaced by a golden egg! Each golden is worth \$75, the cost to fund one chicken business for an Impact Hope graduate. One little girl emptied her piggy bank and gave all her money. Another little girl gave her "tooth" money for losing her tooth. Together, the primary class has raised over \$600. We are inspired by these childrens' giving hearts!
